

Report of the Lay Member of the Virginia Annual Conference

I was honored to once again represent Brosville UMC as the Lay Member to the 240th session of the Virginia Annual Conference held in Hampton, Virginia on June 16-18, 2022. The theme for the conference was "United as One in Worship", based on John 4:24.

One highlight was the overwhelming endorsement of the Rev. Tom Berlin for the office of bishop. "I am not running for bishop. I am simply making myself available for discernment. Your endorsement is one of the most remarkable honors of my life." The annual conference endorsed his nomination and gave him a standing ovation. Bishop Lewis laid hands on Berlin and prayed for him. It was a sparkling moment.

In other business, <u>8</u> churches were discontinued in <u>5</u> districts, three additional churches closed, and $\underline{2}$ new faith communities were started.

The District Initiative was approved creating $\underline{8}$ new districts from the current $\underline{16}$ -district structure. What was the Danville District is now the Mountain View District, under the leadership of the Rev. Denise Bates. This change means that the district now includes Lynchburg churches.

In a difficult session, declaratory decisions concerning the disciplinary process of a pastor were addressed. Tensions arose within the body of the conference, and Bishop Lewis halted proceedings for prayer, and a large crowd gathered in front of the altar. An appeal was made to the Bishop to allow the decision to go to the Judicial Council. A vote was cast and the appeal was approved.

A Missions Service highlighted the many ways the Virginia Conference is in mission throughout Virginia, the country and the world.

42 persons were part of the 2022 retirement class, representing 1,154.5 years of service.

A Service of Remembrance recognized <u>77</u> conference clergy and laity who died.

A Service for the ordering of ministry recognized <u>22</u> persons who were licensed; <u>3</u> were commissioned as provisional deacons; <u>15</u> as provisional elders; <u>2</u> had orders recognized (including Pastor Intek!); <u>1</u> was ordained as a deacon in full connection; and <u>7</u> were ordained elders. It was a beautiful service. I was proud to be there for Pastor Intek.

The closing worship gave us the opportunity to sing together, and learn the ASL version of the hymn "Together We Serve." I got to meet a beautiful service dog who was awesome!

The Rev. Dr. Steve Summers gave the closing sermon that he titled "From Mess to Bless."

"I don't want to insult anyone here," he said, "but I think we are All messed up. Doesn't the Bible say we have all sinned and fallen short of the glory of God? Here's the Good News,

"We move from Mess to Bless when we fully embrace that we are all sinners in need of God's grace. We all need Jesus." And to that I shouted "Amen!", and made my way to the Blue Goose (my truck), and headed home. Of course I had to fill up with gas, which was \$5 a gallon.

I always appreciate the opportunity to serve God by attending annual conferences. One thing I did for the first time was to volunteer to be a golf cart driver for a couple of hours, taking people to their vehicles in the huge parking lot. That was fun! It was a joy to attend the 240th Virginia Annual Conference as the lay representative for Brosville UMC. I pondered the theme of the conference on the drive home. Jesus told the woman at the well that it's not where we worship that counts, but how we worship. Brosville UMC, ponder this with me: is our worship spiritual and real? That was Jesus' question to the Samaritan woman at the well. We must have God's help, says Jesus, to worship Him as we should. May it be so.
